Beyond Borders ECPAT Canada has had the honour of working with the Canadian Centre for Child Protection, with a common goal of ending child sexual exploitation. It gives us great pleasure to recognize the Canadian Centre for Child Protection, for their dedicated work in providing programs, services, and expertise in recognizing, reporting, and preventing child sexual exploitation by presenting them with the 2017 Rosalind Prober Award for Advocacy. The CCCP offers their resources and knowledge to people across Canada including programs for classrooms and invaluable assistance to law enforcement. Programs such as Kids in the Know, Cybertip!ca, Missingkids.ca, and Commit to Kids provide critical information to protecting and educating children and their families. The Canadian Centre for Child Protection's newest program, Project Arachnid, helps identify images of sexual exploitation on the web. Once those images are identified, they can be removed from the online world to prevent further victimization of children.
